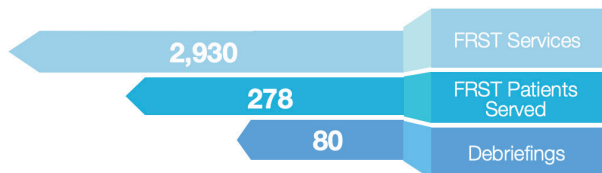


## First Responder Support Team (FRST)

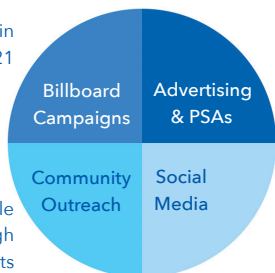

## Suicide Facts in SC

**802** — South Carolinians lost to suicide in 2021

**2.4** — South Carolinians lost each day to suicide

**+46%** — in SC Lifeline Prevention calls in Q1 2022 vs. Q1 2020

**9.4 Million** — SCDMH Funds spent for 1,908 ER admits in 2022

**Every 22 Min** — a South Carolinian is treated for Suicidal Ideation in an Emergency Dept

## Mobile Crisis Response Teams

The SCDMH Mobile Crisis Response Teams operate 24/7 and 365 days a year to triage psychiatric needs, connect individuals to treatment resources, and to respond to crises in communities across South Carolina through partnerships with first responders.
