The primary goal of the FRST team is to provide behavioral health services that are confidential, accessible, effective, safe and comfortable for all first responders and their families. They provide an array of services designed to meet the needs of first

responder personnel and their families including assessment, referrals, short term counseling, trauma-focused therapy, substance abuse treatment, medical consultation, couples counseling and family treatment.


